The digital guide is filled with engaging video content to enhance the visitor experience, including a special introduction from the Museum's Director and CEO, Dr. Ulrike Al-Khamis. Introductions to the Museum's educational and performance programming, Shop, and Diwan restaurant give visitors an idea of what they can expect from a day at the Museum. Audio tours such as the *Diversity Tour*, offer an interactive and accessible way to learn more about the Museum Collections.
