Late spring and summer usually mark the winding down of most performing arts seasons — but not here at the Aga Khan Museum. In this May to August edition of *On Stage*, I am proud to announce an exciting and eclectic mix of programming featuring music, dance, and film.

Our **Great Poets Series** culminates May 15 at Roy Thomson Hall with a performance by the legendary Sufi singer **Abida Parveen**. We are pleased to partner with Roy Thomson Hall on this extraordinary event.

Launching in May, our new **Bollywood Classics Series** gives Toronto audiences the chance to see films — including *Mughal-e-Azam* and *Pakeezah* — rarely shown on large screens. Themes from Mughal India inspire the content of this series, and each of the films has profoundly affected subsequent musical, technical, and aesthetic directions in Bollywood film.

We have also developed a new partnership with Montreal's Kabir Centre to present two performances this summer. In June, we welcome to our stage the recognized maestro of *Kathak* dance, **Pandit Birju Maharaj**. In August, we present **Fannah-fi-Allah Sufi Qawwali Party**, a groundbreaking ensemble that, for over a decade, has brought Sufi devotional music to new audiences.

Our **World Music Series** continues with an August concert by the acclaimed **Mehmet Polat Trio**. Joining instruments and artists from different regions of Turkey and the Dutch Antilles, the trio presents a mesmerizing musical dialogue between traditions and cultures.


